


















































































Teaching Tips and Suggestions

- * Request that "kinks" be worked out before class is set to start
- Create avatars and introduce SL as a group (computer lab)
 - Spend some time on appearance
- Use CESL website help videos -- or create own

Tips and Suggestions (continued)

- Hold synchronous on-campus class (at least initially)
- Screen-capture record class for those who have difficulty
- * Make class interactive, rather than lectureonly - won't have same reluctance/resistance as in physical classroom

Tips and Suggestions (continued)

- Allow extra time for yourself to prepare materials for class
- Have students update software before class (SL Viewer, Flash player)
- Hold practice sessions (for yourself and students)

Practice Session Content

- * Sitting
- Moving/Flying/ Navigating
- * Speaking/Using voice/ Audio Feedback
- * Local Chat vs IM
- How to increase speaker's volume

- * Use of Mini-map
- SL quirks (sometimes you need to log-out and login)
- Address fears and questions (e.g., what happens if I fall? What happens to my avatar?)
- * General Etiquette
