SATURDAY, AUGUST 1st - 6 CEUS Treating Developmental Trauma and Affect Dysregulation

This workshop will use videos and experiential activities to demonstrate methods of treating dysregulated and traumatized children. A model

for structuring the play therapy sessions will be presented.

Participants will learn a specific method for operationalizing the research of Bruce Perry and Richard Gaskill to stimulate the child's brain to heal and develop new neural networks.

As suggested by Perry and Gaskill (2014), traditional psychodynamic or cognitive-behavioral play therapies are largely ineffective with this population until the lower regions of the brain have been re-patterned through somatosensory play activities, which tend to decrease affect dysregulation.

Play activities that are designed to stimulate the lower regions of the brain, which control affect regulation, emotional response, and social cueing will be practiced. These activities include somatosensory play, water/mud trays, EMDR, feeding and emotional attunement.

Learning Objectives:

- 1. Learn a theoretical developmental model for treating early childhood trauma based on current brain development research
- 2. Learn multiple practical tactile sensory activities available to every play therapist
- 3. Learn to assess child readiness for directive and non-directive methods of play therapy based on emotional development
